ST. GREGORY, BISHOP OF OMIR

St. Gregory was first a deacon in the church in Milan and then became bishop of Omir. He was a great shepherd and wonderworker. By his prayers, he was able to bring about great wonders as the following story illustrates: In the Omirian town of Apher, the majority of the inhabitants were Jews. St. Gregory strove to bring them to the Christian faith. Then the Jews suggested to him and to King Avram that they should have a debate on faith, with the assurance that, if they were defeated, they would all embrace the Christian faith. The debate lasted several days, in the presence of several thousand people, both Jews and Christians. The Jews, seeing that they would be defeated by the irrefutable reasons and proofs brought by Gregory, demanded that he in some way show them Christ alive, that they might see Him with their own eyes, and they would then believe. Having utter confidence in the Lord because of the purity of his heart, St. Gregory knelt, facing east, before them all and prayed to God. When he had finished his prayer, the earth quaked and there was a clap of thunder, and the heavens opened to eastward. A luminous cloud appeared from the east, aflame with brilliant rays, and slowly descended to earth at the spot where the people were gathered.
